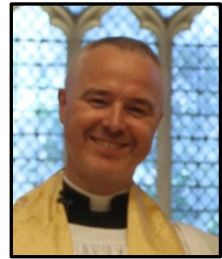


St Mary's Church, Welcome and Invitation

Worship is weekly and follows a pattern that combines traditional and informal styles.

1st Sunday:	9.30am	Holy Communion
2nd Sunday:	9.30am	Methodist Communion
3rd Sunday:	8.00am	Prayerbook Communion

4th/5th Sunday:	9.30am	Holy Communion

We also have a traditional Choral Evensong four times a year, alternating between St Mary's Chalgrove and St Helen's Berrick Salome. This is advertised separately.



Children are **very** warmly welcome at **all** of our services, and we have a very well-equipped children's area.

As well as our Sunday services, we also have a Tot's group that meets on Wednesday at 2pm for songs, stories, toys, and refreshments. Please do bring your little one.

We offer a range of events throughout the year, and would be delighted to see you at any of them. Some are run by the Friends of St Mary's and a welcome letter from them is enclosed.

When you visit Church for a service or an event, please introduce yourself as a newcomer to either me, Stephen, Mel or any of the welcomers, and please consider completing a welcome contact card (also enclosed with this letter).
